#### A FEMALE VETERAN PERSPECTIVE

Handshakes are a common gesture used in professional settings to establish trust, confidence, and respect. In our Post and other informal gatherings, the handshake is like a silent agreement that you won't use hand sanitizer afterwards. Now that the holiday season is over, I wish to put out there a plea to my comrades. For less-firm handshakes for our older or infirm members. I'm not extra sensitive to handshakes. I shake hands all the time.

Males are taught at a very early age to give a strong, firm handshake and to look the person in the eye. Females also learn to do this when learning to compete in the male-dominated society. Speaking from experience, a firm handshake is now painful to me. I used to shake hands with a very firm grip and I miss being able to stand like the rest. Most elderly women have arthritis in their hands (from a lifetime of using hands of love). Elderly gentlemen can also feel pain with a firm handshake, but would seldom complain. I, on the other hand, am quite irritable and will not hesitate to tell you the next time to be gentle with my handshake. (You can confirm this with Unka Bill Carder). Veteran populations have a higher than normal incidence of arthritis in our joints. We need to continue to look out for one another and this is a simple way of doing just that.

I'm not recommending a limp fish or a half-way, fingers only, high society lady handshake. Rather, a full but gentle grip, flesh-to-flesh, without squeezing, until the other person gives you a firm shake as a show of respect.

I do recommend that when greeting any woman past the age of 55 or a man past the age of 70, you start out with a gentle grip and let them show you whether or not a firm handshake is appropriate. This also includes Homie Handshakes.

presidential years by strongly advocating for world peace and improving the lives of the disadvantaged. His energy, integrity and humility were admired by people across the political spectrum. President Carter's wife, Rosalynn, was a leader in mental health awareness. They will both be missed. Our condolences to the entire Carter family and the many lives that they have touched, especially in their home state of Georgia."


